For all of the participating artists art is the language to express their individual idea about the world and the life.

"There is a lot to discover when the visitor studies life and concept of the artists. It may allow new perspectives about the world and their own life. It is also a wonderful experience to realize the kind of feelings a painting evokes when you look at it. Visual art speaks directly to the soul. First of all, there is the visual idea and then the intellectual part. Quite a lot of people think they have to understand an artwork. It is helpful to understand the idea of an artwork, to see it in an art historical context. But you should trust your own idea when you see an artwork for the first time. There is always an interaction."

Keeping true to its name, Diversity also showcased works from emerging artists such as Bahrain-based Jehan Saleh, whose art takes on abstract depth inspired by the styles of Arabic script. Nasr Warour, a Syrian artist based in Dubai, also showcased his work, abstractions that are interpreted from common human experiences.
